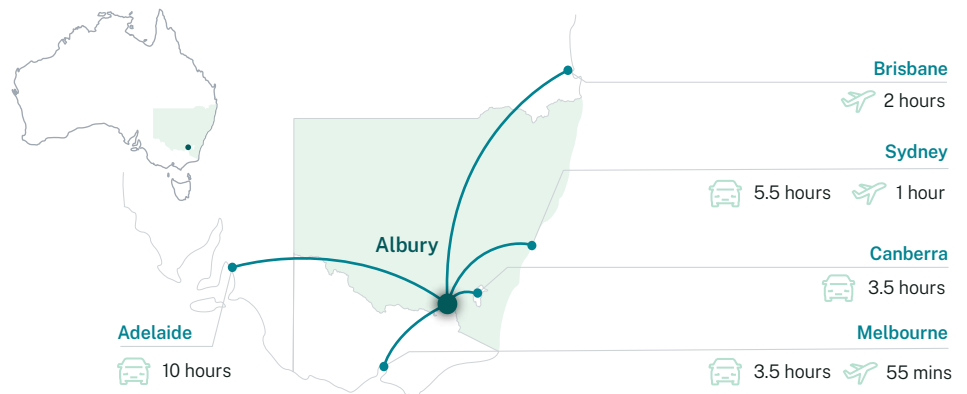
Workforce

Industry outlook

Average increase of 2.5% per year

Affordability

Land is available in the Albury NEXUS Regional Job Precinct from \$37.50 square metres, with concierge support through the planning process. This is outstanding value, representing less than 10 percent of the average industrial land prices in Australia's capital cities such as Sydney or Melbourne.

Access to markets

Proximity to freight routes allows for efficient collection of raw product and distribution of finished goods.

Albury's Industrial NEXUS Precinct features Ettamogah Rail Hub, a common-user rail hub built to handle 30,000 containers per year. The facility offers rail freight to all State capitals and has ample room for further expansion. The Precinct's location on the major transport route between Sydney and Melbourne means 80 percent of Australia's population can be accessed within 24 hours.
