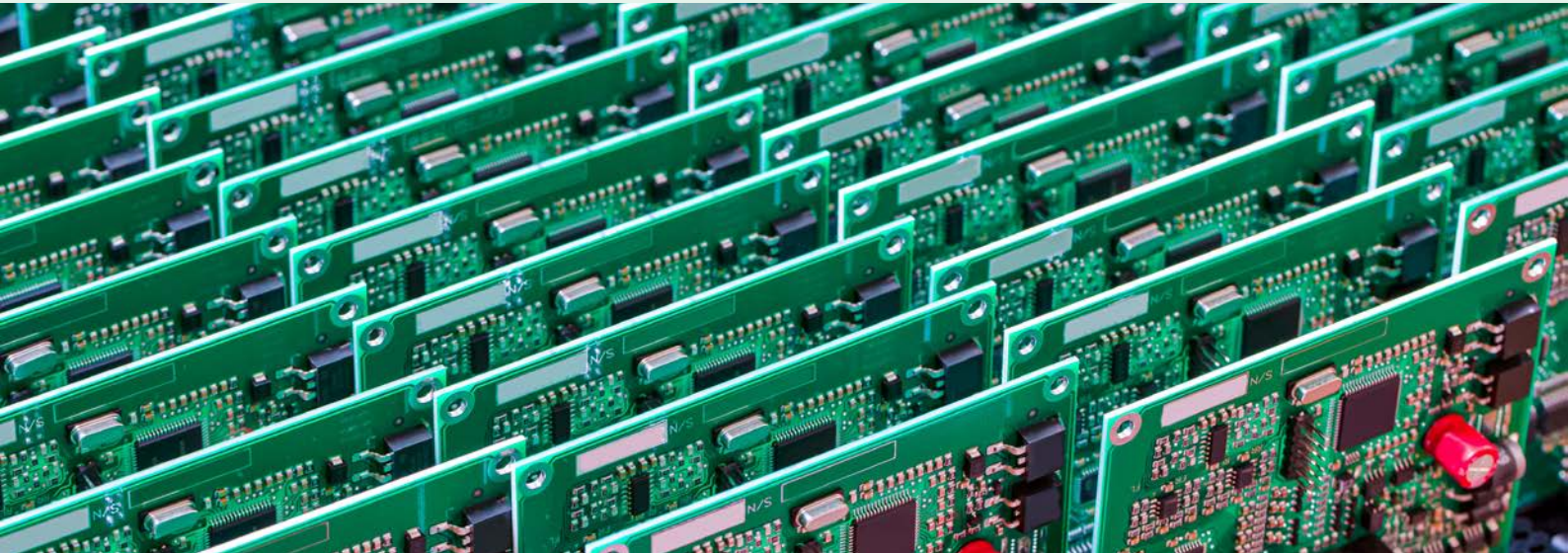

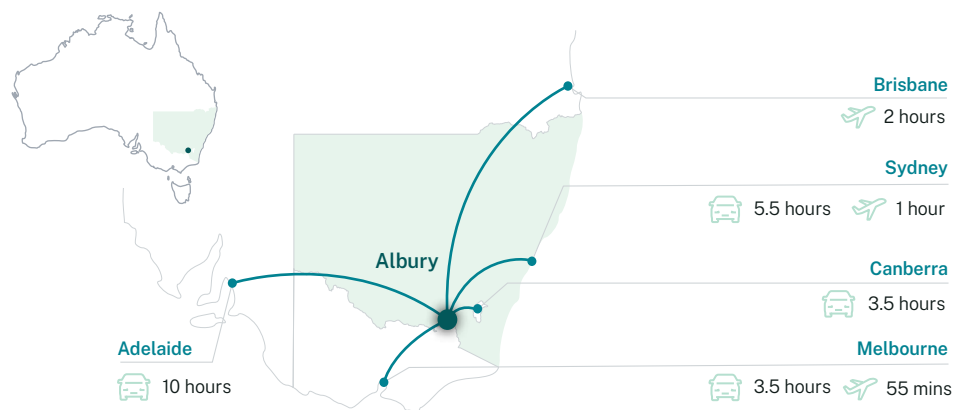
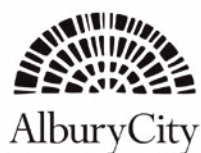

New regulation to drive change

NSW is set to attract more than \$37 billion in renewable energy investment while slashing emissions by 50 percent below 2005 levels by 2030. Under the NSW Electricity Infrastructure Roadmap, NSW will build at least 12 gigawatts of renewable energy generation and at least 2 gigawatts of long duration storage by 2030. Manufacturers of inputs designed specifically for wind, solar or hydroelectricity generation are increasing in demand.

Existing manufacturing hub

The twin cities of Albury-Wodonga have an extremely productive manufacturing sector, outputting \$3.28 billion dollars per year. Some of Australia's most famous and successful manufacturers have set up here, including Visy, Xlam, Mars Petcare, Asahi Beverages, Malibu Boats, Butko, Circular Plastics and many more.

With direct access to the Hume Highway and a seamless network of road and rail links, Albury-Wodonga is within 3 hours drive of Melbourne, 6 hours of Sydney, 9 hours of Adelaide and 3.5 hours of Canberra, putting your business in reach of 80 percent of Australia's population within just 24 hours.

Albury's Industrial NEXUS Precinct features Ettamogah Rail Hub, a common-user rail hub built to handle 30,000 containers per year. The facility offers rail freight to all State capitals and has ample room for further expansion.
