

NSW has endowments of 17 of the 24 minerals identified in the Australian Critical Minerals Prospectus 2020, driving growth in both advanced and emerging projects. Parkes is central to more than 10 critical minerals projects, including five projects in the advanced planning stage. The region is set to supply critical scandium and cobalt to the emerging electric vehicle battery industry.
